## Suyai 2007 · **93 pts.**

The winery's flagship is the 2007 Suyai, is a true beast of a wine. Saturated purple/black in color, it has a nose of brooding black fruits, tar, and licorice. Powerful, dense, and full-flavored, the wine is surprisingly well balanced and very long in the finish. Delicate palates should avoid this wine but if you want to grow some hair on your chest, this might well be the wine for you.

Altos  
Malbec · Petit Verdot  
2008 · **90pts. "Young"**

The 2008 Malbec-Petit Verdot Altos is a saturated purple/black color with outstanding tar, licorice, blackberry, and blackcurrant aromas. It is better balanced than the Syrah-Cabernet blend but will still require significant cellaring. Give it 5-7 years and drink it from 2015 to 2028.

Syrah · Cabernet Sauvignon  
2007 · **88pts. "Young"**

The 2007 Syrah-Cabernet Sauvignon Altos offers an alluring nose of smoke, meat, game, blueberry, and blackberry. On the palate there is significant tannin which will require cellaring of at least 3-5 years. There appears to be more than enough fruit so that in several years my score is likely to appear conservative.

Cabernet Franc · Merlot  
2007 · **87pts. "Young"**

The 2007 Cabernet Franc-Merlot Altos is a saturated opaque purple color. It reveals a brooding nose of herbs and black fruits followed by a firm, structured wine that will blossom with another 2-3 years of bottle age. Drink it from 2012 to 2021.

2008 · **87pts. "Young"**

The Altos series of red wines begins with the 2007 Carmenère-Carignan Altos. An alluring bouquet of cigar box, leather, underbrush, and blueberry lead to a structured wine with plenty of spicy fruit, mineral/earth notes, and a lengthy finish. It will profit from 2-3 years of cellaring and will drink well from 2011 to 2019.

Reserva  
Carmenère  
2007 · **87pts.**

The red wines start with the 2007 Carmenère Reserva, a pleasant, easy-going effort with aromas of coffee / mocha, blueberry, and plum. Ripe and round on the palate, it finishes with no hard edges. Drink it over the next three years.

Sauvignon Blanc  
2008 · **87pts.**

The white wines begin with the 2008 Sauvignon Blanc Reserva from cool-climate Leyda. It reveals a fragrant grapefruit, lemon-lime, and melon nose followed by a crisp, balanced, tasty Sauvignon that will drink well over the next 12-18 months.

Cabernet Sauvignon  
2007 · **86pts.**

The 2007 Cabernet Sauvignon Reserva is a bit more restrained. Blackcurrant and blackberry aromas lead to a slightly tannic wine with savory flavors and moderate depth. It could well evolve for 1-2 years but can be enjoyed now.

The 2008 Chardonnay Reserva is light gold-colored with pear and apple aromas. Round, ripe, and forward, it will drink nicely over the next two years.
